

The partnership between Light International School and Alliance française de Mombasa



Tell us about the collaboration between LIS and your institution

The collaboration between Light International School and Alliance française is very rich and in full development. It is an honour and a pleasure to collaborate with LIS to promote the teaching of French, LIS is one of the most dynamic international schools in Mombasa when it comes to promoting linguistic diversity. Numerous actions have been put in place: such as visits to Alliance, participation of students in cultural events, integration of DELF Prim and DELF Junior into the curriculum etc. In addition, LIS teachers regularly follow the teacher training programmes offered in partnership with the Embassy of France.

Alliance française co-organized at LIS the French Day on October 26, 2023. What was the objective?

Above all, the objective was having fun because that is the driving force behind learning a language. More than 200 children from 7 schools participated in the program which included learning French games, discovery of French gastronomy and visit to a photo exhibition in Paris. Léa Laouaf, Education and Language Project Manager at the French Embassy also honoured us with her presence. It was a great success thanks to the support of LIS academic team.

What's the DELF Prim and Junior?

DELF is the official certification from the French Ministry of Education. Alliance Française is the only accredited institution in Kenya, for international certification of the French language. This certificate is globally recognized. There are 3 levels for DELF Prim (A1.1,A1,A2) for ages 6-11 and 4 levels for DELF Junior: A1, A2, B1, B2 for ages 12 to 16.

The 2023 results at LIS are very encouraging. In 2023, 15 children successfully passed the DELF Prim (9)/ DELF Junior (6), which allows them to get a globally recognized certificate as early as junior and senior school, to prepare them for future international examinations and to bring about career opportunities. It also prepares them for higher education abroad in countries like France, Canada...

We work hand in hand with the LIS teaching team so that students are able to successfully take the DELF Prim and DELF Junior during their schooling.

What advice would you give to parents and children who are passionate about languages?

To children: I would advise them to participate in language classes and to not be afraid of making mistakes when they speak!

To parents: I would encourage them to push their children to learn foreign languages. For it is a great investment for his/her future. Furthermore, learning a language also allows their child to develop learning techniques that will help them perform in other subjects.

The Alliance Française de Mombasa was founded in 1975. It is a local non-profit educational and cultural organization. With the support of the Embassy of France in Kenya and the Alliance française de Nairobi, AF Mombasa fulfills its mission of teaching French language, promoting cultural diversity and developing French-Kenyan partnerships. AFM offers French languages classes for adults and for children on Saturday morning.

Community Service: The GP's View

My GP design during this term enabled me to serve the community in several ways. Giving back to the community does not always mean making large fiscal benefactions or expanding the colony; rather, it can simply mean advancing a helping hand if you feel good enough to do so. Also, by the community, we mean any place like an orphanage, an academy, or a small group of individuals dealing with the same issue, like a place where there's little to no access to healthcare. Why GP?





There were approximately 780 players in the tournament. I played in the under-14 girls category which had around 160 players and above. I played for 11 days, one round every day and we had a free day to go sightseeing in Italy. The rounds were tough. Most of the girls were 14, yet I'm 13 years old. This was a disadvantage to me because I was one year younger than them. But I had to compete with them.

The weather in Italy was cool during the day but cold in the evening. The people in Italy are largely Catholics. They are very kind, and they mainly speak Italian, a little bit of French and English. The streets are very clean, and people mostly live in apartments that are decorated well with a lot of creativity. Montesilvano was near the sea named the Adriatic Sea, but Italy is surrounded by the Mediterranean Sea.

I put all my chess training into the games. I'm good at the Opening and Middlegame but in my endgame, I realized I needed more practice. I would play well in the beginning but towards the end game, my opponents converted the game to their favour. I'll continue training and working on my weaknesses because I definitely would like to play in the 2024 World Youth Chess Championship and if I turn 14 next year, I know I will be better. I know it.



Light International School is proud to be amongst the few schools globally to offer the Internship Program for its students. We target the A-level students after the completion of year 12 and later after the completion of year 13. At this stage, the students are fully aware of their career direction and the majority of them will be already applying to join universities after graduation.



The Internship (apprenticeship) program runs for between two months to four months depending on the agreement with a company, the school, and the guardians of the student.

It is always a golden opportunity for the student to interact with professionals, observe procedures, perform real-life tasks, and get first-hand experience of what it takes to be in a working environment. The students learn important skills even before joining the university.

The program has given our students confidence in their career of choice.

Just before they officially start, students are invited for a pre-visit, during which they are introduced to their supervisors, and informed of what to carry for the internship and any other vital information. Parents of the students are at liberty to join during pre-visits.

In their second week of internship, staff who are members of the Internship committee visit the students for an evaluation of the interns' progress. It is also a good time for the supervisors of the respective companies to brief us on the interns' progress, areas of improvement if any, and areas of strength. The exposure the interns get during the internship period prepares them qualitatively for university studies.

Here at LIS, there is no single, one-size-fits-all strategy. Instead, I work with you each step of the way, offering career tests, resume writing/editing, college essay support, university admission guidance, and career development and networking events amongst many others, to help ensure you can meet your goals and fulfill your career ambition.

I try to provide my students with the tools they need to navigate the many university admissions paths. While the outcomes are crucial, I feel that the most important aspect of university admissions is finding strong matches between individuals and universities. This is your path; denying you access to it is denying you a chance for progress. As a result, I have to support and guide students and their families through this sometimes-daunting process.





OUR CAREER COUNSELLING DEPARTMENT IS A RESOURCE CENTER PROVIDING SUPPORT TO STUDENTS, PARENTS/GUARDIANS, AND STAFF MEMBERS IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

MAPP Career Test: At Light International School in Mombasa, starting from Year 9, we apply the MAPP career test, which helps us understand students' potential and assist them in choosing the proper subjects to lead them to a successful career in harmony with their characteristics. The students are identified through this test in terms of their career tendencies, interests, and vocational capabilities and they are advised to choose their subjects accordingly. Thus, we aim to create an awareness of themselves and believe that students must find out their career pathway and be psychologically ready at the very beginning.



Career Week: Our career week is a highly structured Career Awareness activity in which business partners from a variety of companies or lectures from different fields come together at the school to share information about their jobs, the education, and skills that are required for success in their career.



Senior Parent Meetings: Starting in September, the senior year parents and students are invited to attend meetings about the process of selecting and applying to colleges, financial aid, and senior year activities in general.



Senior Interviews: Every senior student is met at least once in a term to discuss future goals. The discussion may cover admissions, academics, applications, financial aid, or other career choices.



BridgeU: LIS MSA uses BridgeU, a web-based program designed to guide and support students in their career/major search, help students organize any information regarding college applications, compile a balanced college list, and determine best-fit universities.




University Fair: We have so far hosted a myriad of universities in our school estates or had virtual webinars to talk to our students and inform them about a world of opportunities.


