In year 11 and year 12, Biology, Chemistry and Physics have a practical component where the students develop scientific notations and create models to test hypotheses. "Laboratory activities appeal as a way of allowing students to learn with understanding and, at the same time, engage in a process of constructing knowledge by doing science" (Tobin, 1990).





LEARNING SUPPORT AND COUNSELLING

The term started well. The team at the learning support has been working with various students. We assist in areas that prove difficult for students and assist them to overcome blocks to learning and emotional wellbeing.

Kindergarten



We conducted meetings with parents to discuss their child's progress, IEPs, and strategies with the goal of ensuring that every child feels supported, valued, and inspired to reach their full potential. We normally assist learners in class during the lessons. We also withdraw them from class from one on one sessions.

Primary

Classroom Observation: This is done everyday according to our time table. We give support to the students in class during the Maths and English lessons, experiencing learning blocks, delayed milestones and assess for possible learning difficulties.

One on One sessions: We cater for the learning needs during these sessions. We work on speech and language development activities, fine motor skills, social skills and age-appropriate academic support. The learning support teachers assist these learners during exams.

Learning support teachers use the afternoon sessions on every

Thursday life skill lessons.

Secondary

Classroom Observations: Learning Support is all about enhancing learning and ensuring Learners are experiencing high quality teaching and learning. We therefore conduct classroom observations weekly that assist in understanding a child's strengths and weaknesses.

MENTORSHIP

Light International School hosted career development discussions with students and their families. Especially for senior students preparing for university applications, this program provided an opportunity to determine career-related goals.

One-on-one meetings were filled with meaningful conversations that increased students' motivation and provided guidance.

Sleepover programs offered students a unique opportunity for not only academic but also personal development. These programs provided a chance for teamwork, group activities, and enjoyable moments shared together. Additionally, activities such as watching films, reading books, or engaging in other interest-based activities were organized to support students in strengthening their social bonds.

As a result, students gained a broad perspective, enhancing their abilities to express themselves and understand others.
