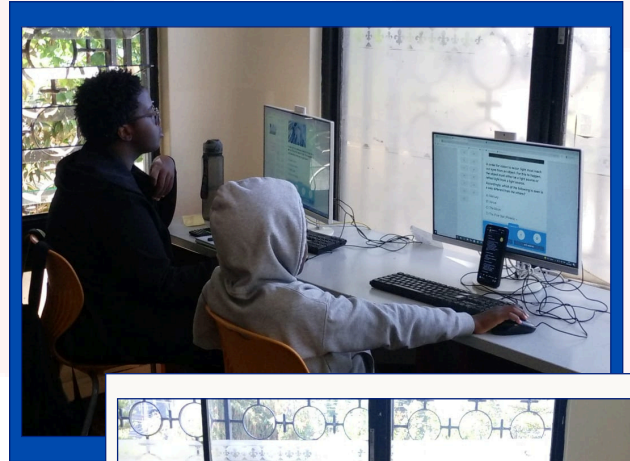


# INTERNATIONAL STEM OLYMPIAD

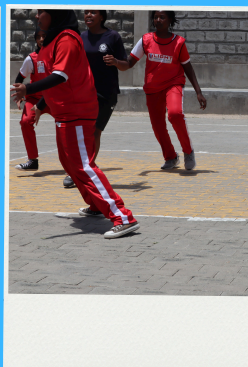
